Event Information for Residents Close to Filton Airfield

To ensure a successful event it is our objective to have minimal impact on the site, environment and local surroundings and we are currently working with experts to deliver this. During the event various professionals (acoustics, security, traffic and health and safety) will be in attendance to proactively implement and manage the plans that have been developed. However, should any resident wish to discuss any concerns or require assistance then we encourage contact (via the details below) during the live event. In doing so we can look to assist in real time and allow us to understand and evaluate any concerns that residents may have.

The band will be playing inside an erected steel structure brought in for this event. The event opens at 4pm on Friday and 5pm on Saturday, with music expecting to finish by 10.30pm on both days.

We anticipate that most visitors will arrive between 6.30pm and 7.30pm on the Friday and 5.30pm and 7.30pm on the Saturday. The majority will of course leave after the event has finished, and we will be ensuring the surrounding area will be cleared as quickly as possible.

Residents should be aware that a sound check may take place on Thursday 28th February in the afternoon and that sound checks will take place on the days of the event between 10am and 4.30pm. They will include a sound propagation test.

Our noise consultants Joynes Nash will be responsible for the management and control of noise on site. They are a company with significant experience of noise management at similar festivals and are available throughout the event to visit and discuss noise. A system will be in place for monitoring and controlling sound levels at the event. However, if at any point in the day or evening of the event, residents feel that the volume is unreasonably high, they are advised to call the following telephone number which will be staffed between 3pm and midnight on both days of the event – 07908639692. If anyone calls this number, we will immediately measure the sound levels at the appropriate location to check that the volume is within permitted levels.

Traffic for the construction of the event infrastructure will start from 18th February using the A38(S) entrance and the removal of equipment from site should be finished by 11th March using the same access.


Customer car parking will be on the airfield and access for these cars will be via the Blenheim and Concorde roundabouts. In order to minimize disruption to residents we have worked with South Gloucester Council to manage traffic flows in and out of the airfield.



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Road Closures:

Finally, please be aware of the road closures which will be in place as a result of the event between 3pm and 1am the following day on both days of the concerts.



- Oak Leaze at Hayes Way
- Charlton Boulevard at Hayes Way
- Cleve Road at A38
- College Way at Filton Avenue

These closures will be manned by appropriately trained and qualified NRSWA Traffic Stewards at the road closure points shown on the map and access for residents will be maintained at all times. The purpose of these closures is to protect residents from excess traffic due to the event and to provide a safe working environment for marshals to redirect drivers. We apologise for any inconvenience caused.



Red cones will be deployed to manage flows out of the site.

We fully appreciate that this event will cause some disruption for local residents around Filton Airfield, please be assured that DHP Family are fully committed to keeping the disruption of the event to a minimum.
